

## Ashby Windward Foundation and 'The Future' health and well being of Carriacou & Petite Martinique

Sunday 21st June, 2009 marked a very special date for two young students from Carriacou. Callista Calliste and Janel Thomas aged 15 and 16 respectively, arrived in Grenada and are the first two students from Carriacou to attend a ten day course at St George's University (SGU) Med/Vet Summer Camp Programme. This unique opportunity was made possible by a grant from the Ashby Windward Foundation (AWF).

The Ashby Windward Foundation initiated and chaired by Dr Christopher is a non-profit corporation which has been involved for sponsoring



or assisting in a number of medical care procedures in the islands of Carriacou & Petite Martinique. Its express purpose is to improve the

medical healthcare system in the Caribbean islands of Carriacou and Petite Martinique and to serve those individuals without the means to pay for necessary medical treatment.

Having their roots in Carriacou, Dr Ashby and the Foundation members have taken pro-active steps to make the mission of the Foundation a self-perpetuating dream, by initiating the programme of sponsorship, which is facilitating Callista and Janel on their first steps towards entering the medical profession.

The Ashby Windward Foundation Educational initiative has its genesis in an idea by the foundation's board of directors whose vision was to sponsor a few students from Carriacou, who



its citizens.

This is the seventh year of the Med/Vet Summer programme. To date, six Grenadian students have had the opportunity to attend the programme, two of whom this year, are from Carriacou. This makes it a unique opportunity for Grenadian students.

The background to this year's selection were that all students in forms four and five of Hillsborough Secondary School and
